Background and Experience

<p>Please briefly present the organisation/group (e.g. its type, scope of work, areas of activity and if applicable, approximate number of paid/unpaid staff, learners and members of the group)</p> <p>Giosef Italy - Youth Without Borders Aps was born in April 1998 to promote active European citizenship and youth mobility. Giosef strives towards the inclusion and participation of youth, particularly youth with fewer</p>

opportunities, in all areas of life. Through our work, we support an ideal of Europe based on the values of solidarity, hospitality, democracy, peace, tolerance, and acceptance of diversity.

Activities:

Giosef Italy works primarily with youth aged 18-35 and youth workers. The organisation develops educational programs rooted in the principles of non-formal education and job trainings adopting an intercultural perspective. Furthermore, it organizes intercultural exchanges and volunteering experiences for young people, as well as conducts seminars, training courses, work placements, active citizenship actions, twinning between cities, conferences, and research.

Key themes and areas of work:

The key themes at the heart of our work are:

- European citizenship: building a shared European identity. Giosef Italy implements projects and campaigns to stimulate a sense of shared citizenship and a European common identity in young people.
- Entrepreneurial spirit: Giosef Italy runs initiatives geared towards bolstering self-esteem, sense of responsibility towards oneself and others and spirit of initiative; as well as implements hands-on projects to support young people, including NEETs, in setting up their own business venture.
- Human Rights Education and non-discrimination: Human rights permeate our projects, with human rights education being one of the main activities of our organization. We are active in the field of non-discrimination and have implemented various projects that seek to combat marginalization, including in an intersectional perspective, and promote social inclusion.

Since 2010, we have managed **EVS projects** both as sending and hosting organization. In the last few years, we have implemented approximately a hundred EVS projects on social, health, solidarity, sport, and environmental issues. We are currently giving continuity to past initiatives via the European Solidarity Corps program. Recognition of the NFE skills and of the youth worker profession is another guiding priority of the organization, and a key rationale behind our **advocacy campaigns** at the national and EU level.

As of 2012, we have worked on education and employment issues through our structured dialogue and EU Youth Programme (Youth, Youth in Action, and Erasmus +). We have developed a range of training courses and projects on youth entrepreneurship in collaboration with universities and public bodies, the National and European Parliament, as well as other stakeholders.

Giosef Italy manages the Euro-Mediterranean Centre for Youth (Il Paguro), hosted in an asset confiscated from the mafia, located in the Municipality of Casapesenna in the province of Caserta and funded by the Department of Youth and the National Civil Service. The Centre is used to develop and deliver training, youth exchanges, and social innovation activities.

Network:

The Giosef Italy network is active in these following cities: Siracusa, Palermo, Firenze, Enna, Caserta, Napoli, Avellino, Potenza, Reggio Calabria, Torino, Bari and Lecce. Our organization is part of the (Italian National Youth Council) and has extensive experience in the coordination and administrative management of European projects, as well as in international cooperation work.

We have 9 paid staff and collaborators as well as several volunteers. The number of paid staff changes according to the number of projects in progress.

What are the activities and experience of the organization in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project?

Giosef Italy collaborates with numerous European organisations and has been involved in various international initiatives in the field of anti-discrimination, hate speech and social inclusion relevant to the proposal in question. Various members of our organization, most notably our President, Alessandro Nicotera, Board Member Alessandra Coppola and Debora Barletta are members of the **EU-wide No Hate speech movement** and are routinely involved in international campaigns to contrast the phenomenon in the digital domain.

In 2019, Giosef Italy was involved in the **HRELOAD" - COMPASS NATIONAL TRAINING COURSE** on Human Rights Education with Young People. HREload is an advanced level training course in the field of Human Rights Education (HRE), promoted by a multi-stakeholder cooperative network of national partners, coordinated by APICE - Integrated Promotion Agency for Citizens in Europe and supported by the Council of Europe. All partner organizations of the National HREload Training Course such as GIOSEF ITALY, CIFA, GCE, REDU, supported by experts from Amnesty International Italy, HREYN - Human Rights Youth Expert Network and No Hate Speech Movement Italy, believe that an innovative approach to Human Rights Education is needed. Thus, HREload focuses on equipping all those who play an educational role in society with the strategic skills to plan HRE activities. More specifically, the project revolves around the concept of "evaluation for change" and stresses the importance of planning an initiative in accordance with the change we want to achieve, whilst monitoring and evaluating each step accordingly. The project is co-funded by the Council of Europe, Youth Department, and the Global Campaign for Education - GCE and implemented in collaboration with the City of Turin.

GIOSEF Italy also runs a [training course](#) on "contrasting hate speech and cyber-bullying" accredited by the National Ministry for Universities, Education and Research. The course strives to bolster knowledge and understanding of online and offline hate speech; support learners in identifying the target groups that are most commonly affected by hate speech; share strategies to prevent, react and combat incitement to hatred; shed light on European best practices in the field of media literacy, critical thinking and prevention of hate speech; and identify user-friendly educational tools that can be employed by youth workers, teachers and other professionals.

Other relevant projects include Project **Inclusi-ON (further details below)** aiming to train stakeholders working in the youth field to promote the inclusion of all young people, particularly young people with fewer opportunities facing multiple forms of discrimination; and project **CLOSER** also focusing on the training for youth workers and participation of young people to build more tolerant and inclusive societies, where difference is not the source of animosity or division, but rather it is celebrated as an added value.

Profiles of staff members who will be involved in the project:

Alessandro Nicotera – Project Manager and Youth Trainer. Member of the Board of Directors of the National Forum of Civil Service. Expert in non-formal education and European youth project management under Erasmus+, with extensive experience in youth exchanges, training courses, and structured dialogue. Specialist in rural development and responsible for Giosef in building the European Coalition for the Rights of NEETs.

Chiara Lombardo – Responsible for Project Communication and Dissemination. During her legal studies, she passionately explored antimafia issues. After graduating in Law, she specialized in communication and marketing strategies. For five years, she managed the communication of the PYC – Palermo Youth Center, organizing informational events on legality. She oversees the online and offline communication of the Giosef Italy national network, designing and producing campaigns and content. In 2021, she conceived and implemented the social campaign *Mafie & Social Media*, supported by the non-profit *Fondazione Progetto Legalità Onlus* in memory of Paolo Borsellino.

Matteo Di Franca – Expert in Youth Policy and Civic Engagement, passionate about Project Management. Head of innovation and projects area of Giosef Italy. Active in Giosef Siracusa since the age of 16, he has held key roles such as Communication Manager, Chief Administrative Officer, Secretary with Treasurer functions, and Project Portfolio Manager. His leadership extended to his vice-presidency of the Provincial Student Council of Siracusa and chairmanship of the Institutional Affairs Commission. Consultant for local authorities and youth associations, he has served as a Project Designer and Manager, engaging over 4,000 young people in sociocultural events in 2022 alone. He is a Project Manager for Erasmus+ initiatives, including KA210, KA105, and KA154. Since 2021, he has also worked as an educator and tutor in social reintegration initiatives

for the Juvenile Court of Catania, in collaboration with Giosef Siracusa.
